What is 'PE and Sport Premium funding'?

In March 2013 the government announced that it was to provide substantial additional funding to improve provision of physical education (PE) and sport in primary schools in England - The Primary PE & Sport Premium.

This funding - provided jointly by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport - is allocated to primary school Head Teachers. The funding is ring-fenced and therefore can only be spent on provision of PE and sport in schools.

Purpose of funding

Schools must spend the additional funding on improving their provision of PE and sport, but they have the freedom to choose how they do this.

The four objectives of the Primary PE and Sport Premium funding are:

- To improve the quality of existing PE teaching through continuing professional learning in PE for generalists, so that all primary pupils improve their health, skills and physical literacy, and have broader exposure to a range of sports
- To increase participation levels in competitive sport and healthy activity of pupils, and maintain these into adolescence
- To increase the quality of initial teacher training in PE and sport, and to promote PE specialisation in primary level workforce
- For schools to show that they understand and value the benefits of high quality PE and sport, including its use as a tool for whole school improvement.

The Impact on our school

SSCO- The children are invited to different sports festivals where they experience different sports activities including; tag rugby, goal ball, orienteering, athletics, rounders, golf, dance, score ball, uni- hock. These events help us gain our kite mark. Which we have sustained a gold or silver. This also offers us training session if we choose to take them and PE experts to run clubs for us. They also help with the organisation of sports day.

PE Specialist- Gives teachers the opportunity to up skill their teaching by observing the PE specialist. Then incorporate new ideas and techniques into their planning. The PE specialist is able to run after school clubs with more skilled teaching in the areas we feel the children need more support i.e. multi sports. We encourage our Pupil Premium children to attend these clubs.

Cyber Coach- An extra teaching tool to encourage physical development. This can also be used at wet play time to get the children moving although still inside. Tai chi has been used to encourage well being and relaxation for the children.

Sports Day- This is a whole school event. All children take part. This builds team spirit and the children also learn how to cope in a competitive environment as well as learning all about winning and losing; these are important life skills to assimilate in preparation for the working environment. At sports day they will have spectators encouraging them on, whether other pupils or their parents.

Swimming - All KS2 (Years 3 + 4 in 2017) have the opportunity for swimming lesson with a professional teacher. The children are split into ability groups so that they get the most out of the lessons.

How Springfield will ensure sustainability

Springfield is up skilling all teachers in their PE teaching. We are gradually replacing equipment that has become outdated or needs replacing due to wear and tear.

Funding for 2017-2018

£16,000 Lump sum plus £10 per pupil = £19,300 (Estimate)
